MPT promotes Travys Montague to chief engineer

OWINGS MILLS, MD – Maryland Public Television (MPT) announced today that Travys C. Montague has been named chief engineer, Transmission & Distribution Department, Technology Division. Montague joined MPT in 2006 and has served as assistant chief engineer for the statewide public television network. In his new role, Montague is responsible for a team of four, managing all MPT broadcast facilities and transmission tower sites across Maryland.
