Maryland Public Television marks opening of major production studio expansion on April 28

WHAT: Media are invited to cover ceremonies and a ribbon-cutting to mark the opening

of The Irene and Edward H. Kaplan Production Studio at Maryland Public

Television (MPT). The event is the culmination of a 20-month project making the now 8,480 sq. ft. studio among the largest in the Public Broadcasting Service

(PBS) system and the tri-state region (MD/VA/DE).

BACKGROUND:

MPT's "Studio A" first opened in 1969, when the statewide public TV network opened its headquarters in Owings Mills, Maryland. The 4,800 sq. ft. studio served as MPT's primary production space for 50 years.

With funding from the State of Maryland, MPT embarked on a \$9.54 million project to significantly expand and upgrade the studio and adjoining plaza. The groundbreaking for the project took place at the celebration marking MPT's 50th anniversary on June 28, 2019. Work commenced in March 2020.

The renamed production studio space is now 75% larger – at 8,480 sq. ft. – and boasts the latest technology and environmental efficiencies. It offers a 16′ x 19′ x 20′ green screen cyclorama wall; 12′ x 14′ loading doors directly into the studio; and a portable theater seating structure for up to 148 studio guests. The building has an additional 3,479 sq. ft. of space to accommodate two dressing rooms, a green room, restrooms, mechanical room, and storage. The entire facility is ADA-compliant and also earned LEED Silver Certification.

Note: MPT is a nine-year Commemorative Partner of The United States of America Vietnam War Commemoration. MPT mounted a multi-year initiative – *MPT Salutes Vietnam Veterans* – culminating in 2016, to honor and welcome home the region's Vietnam War veterans. The Commemoration flag is one of four being flown at the 11 a.m. ceremony, and the national director of the Commemoration will be on hand.
