In her current position, Ms. Respass cultivates and maintains strategic partnerships and works closely with the Maryland State Department of Education to inform MPT's development and implementation of state-approved early learning and professional learning activities for early childhood educators. Her responsibilities include coordinating the activities of professional and technical personnel to develop and implement various professional development models, student learning resources, and family engagement activities in diverse communities.

Ms. Respass leads her team in conducting statewide professional learning sessions in early childhood education practices, particularly in the area of media literacy, developmentally appropriate technology integration, and curricula. Further, in collaboration with PBS, she has led the development of several national professional learning courses and early childhood activities.

A regular presenter at local, state, and national early childhood education conferences, Ms. Respass has served on the Maryland Family Engagement Coalition and chaired its Early Childhood Technology Subcommittee.
