As vice president, Mr. Vaughn leads a team of more than 40 production professionals, maintenance technicians, and security personnel.

Mr. Vaughn's responsibilities include daily operation, planning, budgeting, and management of professionals who operate studios, linear and non-linear edit suites, post-production audio suites, and electronic field units. He also oversees the maintenance and security of MPT's 135,000-square-foot physical plant and manage the network's work-for-hire operations, which provide video production services and facility rentals to serve clients throughout the region.

During his more than 40-year tenure at Maryland Public Television, he has served as a videographer, director, and editor. He came to MPT in 1982 as a summer intern on the program *The Critics' Place*. In 1983, he was hired as a production assistant for the daily program *A.M. Weather*.

In 1989, Mr. Vaughn became a full-time videographer, working on many MPT productions including *Outdoors Maryland*, *To The Contrary*, and *Mini Dragons*. In 1994, he added editing to his list of responsibilities when he became editor for the national weekly show produced by MPT, the Emmy® Award-winning *MotorWeek*. In 1999, he became production supervisor, responsible for all aspects of production for MPT and was promoted to production manager in 2001. In 2004, Mr. Vaughn was promoted to managing director, Production Operations, and to senior managing director in 2022.

Among his career credits, Mr. Vaughn also lists a stint as the lighting director for the Ken Burns 11-hour miniseries *The Civil War*, as director for coverage of the Republican National Convention, and as a production executive for a variety of freelance productions. He has earned multiple Emmy Awards for lighting and videography. Vaughn was inducted to the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences National Capital Chesapeake Bay Chapter's prestigious Silver Circle in 2021, recognizing his more than 25 years as a significant contributor to the statewide public TV network. He is also part of the current class of Leadership Baltimore County.

Mr. Vaughn resides in Sykesville, Maryland with his wife and two daughters.
